Replacing all of the signal equipment and retiming the crossing
Morton EB right turn lane
Removing the slip lane next to the PD
Sidewalk bump outs
Consolidating bus stops on Morton ST WB
Floating bus stops on BHA, bike lanes go behind the bus stopS
Losing 7 spaces on the slip lane

Removing the Center median between Cortland and Harvard
Restricting the left turn onto Courtland
Sidewalk bumpouts at RRFB at Courtland Road
